### **Blake Edwards**, Clinical Program Manager, Children's Home Society of Washington

Blake has served as a clinical supervisor at multiple agencies, as clinical director for a treatment foster care program in Dallas for three years, and in addition to management roles has provided psychotherapy services to children, families, and adults for over eleven years in Texas and Washington state. ### **Connie Davis, MN, ARNP, GNP, BC (Washington State) RN (Washington State and BC)** Development Lead, Centre for Collaboration Motivation and Innovation (CCMI)

Connie Davis provides quality improvement, system design, and self-management expertise to health care systems and professionals internationally. She is a nurse practitioner specializing in care of the elderly and is the development lead of the non-profit Centre for Collaboration Motivational and Innovation. She has participated in many improvement and redesign initiatives at the national, provincial, regional and local level with the goal of improving health and health care. She is the author or co-author of publications on health promotion, chronic illness care, quality improvement, and self-management support. Connie is also a member of the Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers.

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#### **Dr. John Kern, MD**, Clinical Professor, University of Washington

Dr. John Kern, MD serves as Clinical Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences. His work focuses on training and implementation of the Collaborative Care model. He has been involved with the American Psychiatric Association's TCPI grant, providing training in Collaborative Care to psychiatrists and primary care providers across the country, with a special focus on leading a years-long series of learning collaboratives for providers on Collaborative Care. He also serves as the Clinical Director, Community Psychiatric Consultation, supporting and improving psychiatric consultation to Collaborative Care programs across the state of Washington for the UW-AIMS Center. Prior to his UW appointment, he was for 22 years the Chief Medical Officer at a Regional Mental Health Center in Merrillville, IN, where he developed and supervised several collaborative care programs (including IMPACT-model Collaborative Care program and a SAMHSA grant providing primary care for a seriously mentally ill population), and then developed and served as Chief Medical Officer of a new Federally Qualified Health Center. He is one of the authors of two American Psychiatric Press textbooks on integrated care for psychiatrists. Other interests include the expansion of scope of the Collaborative Care model, innovations directed towards improving the psychiatric workplace, and improving the quality of instruction provided to practitioners of Collaborative Care.

#### **Senator Linda Evans Parlette**, Executive Director, North Central Accountable Community of Health

Senator Parlette is currently the Executive Director of the North Central Accountable Community of Health (NCACH). Prior to accepting this position she was a member of the Washington State Senate and served the state's 12th Legislative District for 20 years, and filled the Elected Official position on the NCACH Governing Board Chair. While in the Senate, Linda served as Senate Republican Caucus Chair for 10 years, was a member of the Health and Long-Term Care; Ways and Means; and Rules committees, and was the ranking Republican on the Capital Budget in 2011 - 2012. In 1968 Senator Parlette earned her bachelor's degree (with honors) in Pharmacy from Washington State University. She has worked many years as a pharmacist for many independent pharmacies across North Central Washington. Her pharmacy background informs her legislative work to improve access to health care, which includes service on the National Conference of State Legislatures' Health Care Committee; the governor's Blue Ribbon Commission on Health Care; the state's Joint Task Force on Mental Health Services and Financing; and the Adult Behavioral Health System Task Force, which she co-chaired. Locally Senator Parlette has served as a former member of the North Central ESD board and a former Chair of the Lake Chelan School board. Senator Parlette served as a member of the William D. Ruckelshaus Center's Advisory Board, is active in Rotary, and other community activities.

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#### **Peter Morgan**, Director of Whole Person Care, North Central Accountable Community of Health

Peter Morgan is the Director of Whole Person Care for the North Central Accountable Community of Health. Peter is a retired Seattle health care executive who has been living in Okanogan County for the last 7 years. He has been on the Family Health Centers board for 6 years and currently serves as Board Chair. He also served on the North Central Accountable Community of Health Board and a number of other non-profit boards over the years, including the Washington State Hospital Association, Health Care Financial Management Association, Country Doctor Community Health Centers, and King County Project Access. Peter retired from Group Health Cooperative in 2010 where he worked in a variety of roles for 18 years, the last 5 as the Executive Vice President for Delivery System Operations. Peter has a B.A. in History from the Colorado College and an M.B.A. in Finance from the University of Denver. He was also licensed as a C.P.A. and worked at EY (*Ernst & Young*) and as an independent consultant for 12 years prior. He has a passion for improving the effectiveness of health care organizations and has been involved with innovation and change management for his entire career.

#### **Dr. Peter Rutherford, MD**, CEO, Confluence Health

Dr. Rutherford is a General Internist, who has been the CEO of Confluence Health since its formation in 2013. After graduating from Whitman College, he attended the University of Washington School of Medicine, and then completed his Internal Medicine residency at the University of Utah. After practicing Internal Medicine in a two person practice for 5 years in Cody Wyoming, he returned to Wenatchee in 1990 and has practiced Internal Medicine since then. In addition, he is a member of the Washington State Hospital Association Board of Directors and also serves on the board of the Washington Health Alliance.

#### **Roger Chaufourrier**, CEO, CSI Solutions

Mr. Chaufourrier is currently Chief Executive Officer of CSI Solutions, LLC a Washington, D.C. health care innovation and consulting services company. Mr. Chaufourrier has extensive experience as a health care strategist, consultant and leader in the field. He serves on several technical advisory groups relative to

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Medical Homes and Accountable Care Organizations. He has designed and implemented a variety of innovative models and demonstration programs for Medicaid agencies and the federal government.
